BACKGROUND: The City Council of the City of Palm Beach Gardens finds that balloons, glitter, and confetti products pose an environmental hazard to the health, safety, and welfare of the residents and visitors of Palm Beach Gardens, Florida, as well as negatively impact the environment and surrounding wildlife.

Balloons, glitter, and confetti products are primarily made of non-biodegradable materials that frequently escape collection and become litter, often floating on water or through the air a far distance from the site of their original use.

Balloons, glitter, and confetti products have little value and constitute a portion of the litter and pollution in the City's waterways, stormwater drains, rights-of-way, parks, and other public places. Marine life and other wildlife often mistaken balloons, glitter, and confetti debris for food, causing significant health complications. This prohibition will further the City's sustainability and environmental protection efforts.

The City desires to encourage residents of the City and local businesses to strive to reduce the use of balloons, glitter, and confetti products to mitigate negative impacts to the City's natural environment.

The City Council desires to direct the City Manager to negotiate to include "no balloons, glitter, and confetti products" provisions into all contracts, as applicable.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends approval of Resolution 69, 2021 as presented.

	WHEREAS, the City Council desires to direct the City Manager to negotiate to include "no balloons, glitter, or confetti products" provisions into all contracts, as applicable; and
	WHEREAS, the City Council deems approval of this Resolution to be in the best interests of the health, safety, and welfare of the residents and citizens of the City of Palm Beach Gardens and the public at large.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALM BEACH GARDENS, FLORIDA, that:

SECTION 1. The foregoing recitals are hereby affirmed and ratified.

SECTION 2. The City Council hereby finds and concludes that it is in the public's best interest to reduce the use of balloons, glitter, and confetti products in the City.

SECTION 3. The City Council does hereby authorize the City Manager to administratively prohibit the use of balloons, glitter, and confetti products on all public property within the City, except when such use may be approved by the City Manager, or designee, when deemed prudent.

16 <u>SECTION 4.</u> The City Council further directs the City Manager to negotiate to 17 include "no balloons, glitter, or confetti products" provisions into all contracts, as 18 applicable.

20 <u>SECTION 5.</u> The City Council encourages the reduction of the sale and use of all
21 balloons, glitter, and confetti products by all residents and businesses within the City.

SECTION 6. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.
