EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Business Development Board ("BDB") has approached the City of Palm Beach Gardens ("City") to request the City's local support for the Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund (QTI) Program for "Project Falcon". Project Falcon is a global company in the Aviation/Aerospace/Engineering industry cluster. The company is currently in the City of Palm Beach Gardens and is considering expanding its staffing due to the increase in client work it has acquired.

DISCUSSION

Project Falcon is requesting from the State's QTI Program economic incentives in the amount of \$800,000 with a local required contribution of \$160,000, which is 20% of the total amount. The Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners is considering 10% of the local contribution in the amount of \$80,000 at its June 7, 2016, meeting. The company is requesting \$80,000 from the City, which is the remainder of the local match contribution. The local match is required for the expansion to occur locally. It is important to note that Project Falcon is also considering another option for its expansion, which includes moving jobs out of state to Kentucky (location where the company currently has vacant space available).

Project Falcon has committed to a Capital Investment of \$3 Million. The company also intends to retain 450 existing local jobs and create 200 new jobs, with the new jobs having an annual average wage of \$66,098, which is 150% of the State of Florida's annual wage.

Staff has reviewed the information and supports the request of \$80,000 as the 10% local match to the QTI Program to be disbursed in accordance with the guidelines set forth by the Department of Economic Opportunity and subject to the following conditions:

- Evidence is provided to the City that Project Falcon has an Agreement with the Department of Economic Opportunity for the QTI Program;
- Palm Beach County has approved its economic development incentive award amount;
- There has been a public announcement of the project's expansion in the City of Palm Beach Gardens; and
- d. Final payment will be disbursed when evidence is provided to the City that the 450 local jobs have been retained in the City of Palm Beach Gardens and the 200 new local jobs are created within the City of Palm Beach Gardens, and the \$3 Million in Capital Investment is within the City of Palm Beach Gardens.

If approved, an economic development agreement will be brought to the City Council for final approval.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends APPROVAL of Resolution 38, 2016 as presented.

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALM BEACH GARDENS, FLORIDA that:

SECTION 1. The foregoing recitals are hereby affirmed and ratified.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> The City Council hereby recommends "Project Falcon" be approved as a Qualified Target Industry Business pursuant to Section 288.106, *Florida Statutes*. The necessary cash commitment of local financial support for the Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund Program exists for "Project Falcon" in the amount of \$80,000, which constitutes half, 10%, of the required local financial support.

SECTION 3. The approval is subject to the following conditions, which shall be the responsibility of "Project Falcon":

- The \$80,000 local match funding will be made available in accordance with the guidelines set for by the Department of Economic Opportunity with the stipulation that these funds are intended to represent 10% of the "local financial support" required by Section 288.106, Florida Statutes.
- The initial disbursement of the local support match for the QTI will be disbursed when the following occurs:
 - Evidence is provided to the City that it has an Agreement with the Department of Economic Opportunity for the QTI Program;
 - Palm Beach County has approved its economic development incentive award amount;
 - There has been a public announcement of the project's expansion in the City of Palm Beach Gardens; and
 - d. Final payment will be disbursed when evidence is provided to the City that the 450 local jobs have been retained in the City of Palm Beach Gardens, and the 200 new local jobs are created within the City of Palm Beach Gardens and the \$3,000,000 in Capital Investment is within the City of Palm Beach Gardens.

SECTION 4. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.
