1 <u>SECTION 1.</u> The proposed amendment to Section 4-1 of the City's Charter shall 2 read as follows:

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4 The elective officers under this Charter shall be the five (5) members of the city council. The selection of members of the city council shall be by groups to be known as 5 Groups 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5. The council members in Groups 2 and 4 shall, in the year 1977, 6 be elected for a term of three (3) years, and for three- (3) year terms thereafter; council 7 members in Groups 1, 3, and 5 shall be elected for a term of three (3) years in the year 8 1978 and for three- (3) year terms thereafter. The term of office of council members shall 9 commence on the first regularly scheduled meeting of the city council following the date 10 of their election and shall continue for three (3) years thereafter until their successors are 11 elected and qualified. No individual shall be elected to the office of council member for 12 more than two (2) three (3) consecutive full terms. Service in a term of office that 13 commenced prior to the effective date of any term limit enacted on council members will 14 be credited against any term limitation approved by the Palm Beach Gardens' electorate. 15 16

17 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The Charter amendment proposed by this Ordinance shall be 18 submitted to the electors of the City of Palm Beach Gardens, Florida, at the general 19 municipal election to be held on the 13th day of March, 2018, in the form of the following 20 question:

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31 32 CITY OF PALM BEACH GARDENS REFERENDUM QUESTION NO. 2 SHALL THE PALM BEACH GARDENS CHARTER BE AMENDED TO CHANGE THE EXISTING TERM LIMIT OF TWO (2) CONSECUTIVE FULL TERMS TO THREE (3) CONSECUTIVE FULL TERMS.

33 <u>SECTION 3.</u> The City Clerk shall cause a notice of this election called for the 35 purpose of presenting the subject Charter revision to a vote of the electorate to be 36 published in accordance with the provisions of Section 100.342, *Florida Statutes*, at least 37 twice: once in the fifth week and once in the third week prior to the week in which the 38 referendum is to be held; provided that the first publication shall take place at least 30 39 days before the date fixed for the referendum and shall be published in a newspaper of 40 general circulation within the City.

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42 <u>SECTION 4.</u> In accordance with Section 26-11 (a) of the City Code of Ordinances, 43 the City Clerk shall cause a notice of election to be published in a newspaper of general 44 circulation within the City at one time during the fourth week and at one time in the second 45 week preceding the week in which the election is held.

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SECTION 5. In accordance with Section 26-14 (d) of the City Code of Ordinances, the City Clerk shall publish a sample ballot in a newspaper of general circulation prior to the day of the election, but no more than ten days prior to the election. Such publication shall be conspicuous and not be included within the legal notices and advertisements being published per Chapter 50, *Florida Statutes*.

SECTION 6. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict be and the same are
hereby repealed.

<u>SECTION 7.</u> Should any section or provision of this Ordinance or any portion thereof, any paragraph, sentence, or word be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance.

SECTION 8. Specific authority is hereby given to codify this Ordinance.

16 <u>SECTION 9.</u> This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption. 17 The revised language in Section 4-1 of the Charter as set forth in Section 1 hereinabove 18 shall become effective as of 12:01 a.m. on March 14, 2018, if the question to be voted 19 upon provided hereinabove receives an affirmative vote of the majority of the valid votes 20 cast and counted at the election held on March 13, 2018.
